# **Rivermead Primary School**

## PE and Sports Premium Statement 2018/19

This document reviews the spending and impact of the PE & Sports Premium Grant for 2017/18 academic year

Rivermead Primary School understands and values the importance of physical activity and sport. The children are encouraged to undertake a range of sports and activities both within the Physical Education (PE) curriculum and also in extra-curricular activities.

## **Premium Sports Funding**

The Government is providing funding 'PE & Sports Premium' of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

### **Purpose of funding**

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

In the academic year we received £15,334. Rivermead the School Leadership Team and Governors spent the grant on the following to support PE & Sport:

#### **Resources:**

The Funding was used in various ways to purchase new equipment, resources and sports kits across the school, and improve the quality of sport/PE provision:

- New equipment for EYFS, KS1 and KS2 to enhance the learning & teaching of PE: £150
- Purchase of two gym mats: £130
- Affiliation fees for to enter local leagues: Wokingham FA, Wokingham Tag Rugby, Wokingham Cricket: £120
- FFS coach for netball: £325
- FFS coach for Afterschool clubs: £900
- Year 5 swimming lessons: £1000
- 'Didi-rugby' sessions for 60 EYFS children: £675
- The cost of transport to providing school sporting opportunities: £959
- Cups, medals, stickers for sports days and competitions: £150
- Astro-turf for the use of KS1 children: £6,100 (an additional £6,100 donation from the school's PTA)
- Use of First for Sport coaches for PPA and teacher development in Year 1 to Year 6: £5,500

# **Qualified Sports Coaches:**

The school has hired the services of First for Sport, a coaching company who already deliver some of our after school clubs, to deliver PE lessons alongside our staff including: invasion games, dance, and striking and fielding games. During the academic year of 2017-18, Year 3 enjoyed a weekly dance lessons within PE from a specialist dance instructor/coach. We also had another specialist coach Miss Sophie Rowse working across the school from Year 1 to year 6, providing specialist PE lessons, focusing on football, tennis, athletics, and fitness.

#### **Swimming**

Year 5 take part in a 10 week swimming programme at Academy Sport during the spring term. Four qualified coaches are provided, with the children divided into 3 attainment groups. The aim by the end of the programme is the children are able swim 25 metres independently. The children are transported to and from the venue by coach. The school paid £100 per child from the PE & Sports Funding, with the parents paying the remaining amount through a voluntary contribution. 53 out of the 57 children were able to complete the 25 metres swim independently by the end of the programme.

## Providing places for pupils for after school sport club

Our school already offers a range of lunchtime and after school clubs, accessed by children from Key Stages One and Two. These clubs will continue to run as before, with a small fee charged by the coaches who deliver these clubs. Since the introduction of the Sports Funding in September 2013, we have being using part of the funding to help subside externally run clubs to enabling more children, especially the more vulnerable pupils, to access clubs which incur a cost.

In the past twelve months (academic year 2017-18) the following range of sporting clubs were on offer to children within the school:

Tag Rugby, Cricket, Football, Judo, Multi-skills, Gymnastics, Freestyle Gymnastics, Street-dance, Cheerleading, Relax Kids and Running Club.

The number of children in various sports clubs for academic year 2017-18:

## **School Sport Events & Competitions**

Rivermead is entering and competing at more sporting events allowing children in all Year groups to access a form of competitive sport against other schools. We feel it is important to provide opportunities for the children to train weekly and then compete against other schools. Funding was used to supply additional equipment/resources and to pay for transport to and from sporting events and activities that were not held at Rivermead Primary School.

## Impact:

The quality of the teaching of PE has risen through the expertise of having specialist coaching within PE lessons. Teaching staff have benefitted from accessing materials (planning, resources, and teaching ideas) to ensure their own teaching of PE has improved, engaging and motivating pupils through the PE curriculum.

More clubs have been provided, through sourcing external agencies, which has supported the school in promoting a 'Healthy Lifestyle' with the children.

The school has entered more competitions, and have taken time to provide weekly coaching sessions either afterschool or at lunchtimes. This has developed the values of sport – teamwork, cooperation, support, respect, fair play, and determination. The children are proud to represent their school and has given many a sense of belonging and achievement. The school has enjoyed a successful year competing, especially with Tag Rugby and Football.

### **Use of Premium funding 2018.19:**

The School's Leadership Team and Governors are using the Premium Sports & PE Funding in the following way for 2018.19:

### PE Teaching & Staff Development

The school has developed the partnership and use of First for Sport with the teaching of PE and providing development for teaching staff and will benefit all children from Year 1 to Year 6: Number of children - 350 The benefits will be for both the children and staff – children being taught by a member of the First for Sport staff, and teaching staff will be developed through observing/assisting in PE lessons, attending CPD sessions held by coaches, sharing good practice.

### Extra-Curricular Clubs

Rivermead will be accessing a variety of external agencies to continue the availability of various extra-curricular sports clubs. Where pupils are unable to access clubs because of the cost, support will be provide by the school through the Premium Sport Funding.

#### Impact

The school is aiming for a 5% increase in places taken in various extra-curricular clubs

Increase the opportunities for children to experience some form of exercise/fitness/team work through increasing lunchtime provision.

Extend the number of sports where we enter our sports teams in competitions – Netball & Hockey Successful seasons for the Tag Rugby & Football in Year 5/6 with their various competitions/leagues
